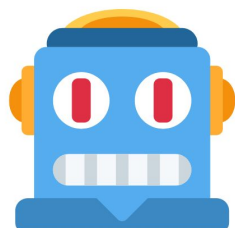

Ingredients: Pens and paper or computer/laptop.

Malware bingo. Malware is software that is harmful to electronic devices. Its name comes from the words "malicious" and "software." There are many different types of malware and people who work in cyber security like Libby have to remember lots of terminology/words like these >> Today we will play bingo so we are more familiar with these words, you can also play this with your household. Give everyone some time to understand all these words. Get them to choose 9 words and write them in a 3x3 grid. The leader will read out the definitions of 9 words, everyone else will cross off the word if the definition matches. The first person to get a 3 in a row, is the runner up, the first to get all 9 is the winner.
